To provide quality Christ-centred education to the children of the Sunshine Coast, developing in them strong foundations for life and learning.



Inquiry activities and engaging real-world projects allow students to undertake learning that is challenging, adventurous and meaningful. Through our Foundations for Learning, students learn to:

- Improve by developing a growth mindset that allows them to learn from mistakes.

Our Primary students are able to grow through many learning opportunities, including:

- Weekly lessons in the Resource Centre
- Learning support and extension programs
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM), coding and robotics projects.

- Extension and learning support programs
- College-leased laptops for all Secondary students
- Career exploration and guidance programs

- A wide range of enrichment and elective subjects
- Opportunities for community service and leadership development
- Weekly Christian Studies lessons where the Bible is explored
- Weekly Chapel services and assemblies

Our Senior Secondary program, the final phase of our students' time at Caloundra Christian College, has a distinct focus on student-driven pathways. It is a time of significant emotional and physical growth and a time when a student's identity begins to take a more defined form as they approach maturity and adulthood.

At CalCC, we tailor-design education and training plans for each Senior student so they are equipped to achieve their goals.

Our students have access to a wide range of general and applied curriculum offerings that are approved and supported by the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA). Vocational education and training courses also equip students with nationally recognised qualifications in business, tourism, engineering pathways, health services, information communication technology, hospitality and Christian ministry. The College maintains close collaborations with trade training and tertiary institutions across the Sunshine Coast.

Our students are encouraged to excel in their chosen pathways, be they academic and/or school-based apprenticeships and traineeships. The College works closely with employers and training organisations to maximise long-term employment opportunities for our students.

With an emphasis on developing leadership and citizenship skills, our students are supported to build strong foundations for an exciting and purposeful future after leaving the College. They will take on challenges that establish confidence in their own talents skills and abilities.

Students learn to think for themselves and extend their learning beyond the curriculum, with the knowledge that their teachers are always there for them if they need help and guidance.


 Caloundra Robotics Innovation and Business (CRIB) is a club where students explore the world of robotics, technology and entrepreneurship.
